



Attendance Matters By Number of Lessons Missed 95% = 63 lessons missed each year 9 school days 90% = 126 lessons missed each year 18 school days 189 lessons missed each year 85% = 27 school days 80% = 252 lessons missed each year 36 school days

- Regular school attendance is a major component of academic success.
- Excused absences, tardies and early dismissals include:
 - > personal illness
 - > illness or death in the family
 - impassable roads or weather
 - > religious observance
 - > quarantine
 - required court appearance
 - approved field trips
 - approved guidance/admin appt
 - > All others are unexcused
- Missed schoolwork/tests:
 - Excused absence: arrange with teachers to make up work. Opportunity to make up test/quiz for full credit.
 - Unexcused absence: consult with teacher upon return, regarding the missed work. Make up work must be completed by a date specified by the teacher. Work may be assigned partial credit.


At Suffern Middle School





Setting Goals




Doing things that have meaning
